UNDER-GROUND SERVICE AGREEMENT: COMMERCIAL

I understand that in requesting TRAVERSE CITY LIGHT & POWER to trench in under-ground electric service lines, I agree to pay a cost of \$5.50 summer, \$8.25 winter*, per trench foot length, plus \$50.00 for overhead to underground conversion. This is based on a clear and unobstructed path, a minimum of 24" deep for secondary, 36" deep for primary, from the source to the metering location. Where conduits are required under paved areas or other areas deemed necessary by TCL&P, the customer shall either install the conduits in accordance with TCL&P's engineering requirements or pay TCL&P to install these needed conduits. Where the customer installs conduit, the underground charge will be reduced by \$1.00 per foot. Any subterranean boring required or removal of obstacles such as rocks, old foundations, trees and stumps will be billed to the customer at actual cost.

LIGHT & POWER will back fill the trench and level the ground at the time of installation.

LIGHT & POWER will not be responsible at a later date for earth settling of the trench, or for putting in black dirt, or sod over the trenched area, also LIGHT & POWER will not be responsible for any damage to the yard from equipment crossing the property to install the under-ground electric service.

LIGHT & POWER will not be responsible for any unforeseen obstacle(s) or design changes that will change or complicate the installation of the under-ground facilities. These actual costs will be born by the customer requesting this service.

The customer warrants that they have the legal right and/or legally binding easements necessary conveying the authority to permit TRAVERSE CITY LIGHT & POWER to occupy the premises associated with this installation.
