

Bay Street Underground - Engineering Services with GRP Engineering

Staff has been in discussion with GRP Engineering, Inc. for professional engineering design and construction inspection services for the installation of underground electric and communication facilities along Bay Street, in the area east of Division Street and the Division Street crossing.

These facilities will be an extension of existing underground facilities previously installed in 2002. There will be two construction contracts awarded at a later date, one for the conduit installation and a second for the electrical cable installation.

Staff recommends entering into an agreement with GRP Engineering, Inc. for professional engineering design services in the amount of \$ 122,000 and for construction inspection and coordination services in the amount not-to-exceed \$44,000.

Community Investment Fund Recommendations

Vice Chair Linda Johnson and board members Ralph Soffredine and John Welch, along with Ed Rice, Jim Cooper and I met on March 14 to discuss the twenty Community Investment Fund (CIF) grant applications received for the 2010-11 funding period.

After reviewing the applications, the funding recommendations are as follows:

- \$3,000 to Traverse City Area Public Schools to help fund the SCI-MA-TECH program.
- \$15,000 to the City of Traverse City to fund the universal small boat launch as part of the Bay Front Improvement Plan.
- \$12,000 to the Inland Seas Educational Association to fund ten TCAPS schools to take part in the Great Lakes Schoolship Program.
- \$5,000 to Traverse Area Community Sailing to help fund the purchase of additional boats with TCL&P logos.
- \$5,000 to the Grand Traverse Pavilions Foundation to help fund the lighting and sound reinforcement of the Grand Lawn gazebo.
- \$10,000 to TART Trails to help fund the development of the Buffalo Ridge trail.
- \$5,000 to the Cherry-T Ball Drop for LED lights and an illuminated countdown clock.
- \$4,500 to Traverse City Area Public Schools to help fund the studies of electricity, magnets and motors for 1st, 3rd and 4th graders.

The CIF has a \$75,000 budget allocated for the 2010-11 fiscal year and the above recommendations total \$59,500.

If the above recommendations are approved I will work with each organization to help promote the partnership and continued exposure of TCL&P and the CIF.

The CIF policy and all Common Grant Application Forms are attached. Complete grant applications are available at the TCL&P office for review. All requests are open for discussion.

Provisions and Guidelines Revised April 2004

About the Community Investment Fund

Our mission at Traverse City Light and Power (Light and Power) is to provide safe, reliable electricity at the lowest rates in the area. At the same time, we have a responsibility to invest our resources in the community we serve, with the goal of helping to make our town a better place to live. One way we do that is through the Community Investment Fund (CIF). Each year, Light and Power allocates funds to the CIF for the purpose of providing assistance to non-profit organizations in the Light and Power service area.

Our Values and Vision

The vision of the CIF is to enhance the quality of life in the Traverse City area by supporting the values that are commonly shared in our community. Traverse City Light and Power charitable contributions are focused on three key areas:

- Community Development Public infrastructure programs and other projects that provide a direct benefit to our customers and the people of the Traverse City area, with an emphasis on programs and projects within our service area.
- Energy-Related Educational Programs Programs and projects that educate people of all ages about current and future energy sources, and the financial benefit of energy conservation.
- Natural Resources/Environmental Programs and projects aimed at maintaining and improving the quality of natural resources, and supporting a sustainable environment in the Traverse City area.

Community Investment Fund Guidelines

Funds are generally awarded to foster and further the above values and vision to non-profit organizations or groups for specific educational, environmental and community development purposes. The requesting organization must reside in the Traverse City area, be non-profit (i.e. be exempt from federal income tax under the Internal Revenue Code) and operate for public purposes.

Preference is given for CIF requests that:

- Are one time in nature, rather than ongoing
- Benefit a large number of people
- Leverage funds from other sources
- Help programs increase their capacity to deliver services

The CIF does not provide support to:

- Individuals (including those seeking direct scholarships)
- Political parties, organizations or activities
- Religious organizations for religious (denominational) purposes
- Student group trips
- National or international organizations, unless they are providing benefits directly to our service-area residents
