**Subject:** Commercial/Industrial Customer Rate Stabilization

In June the Light & Power Board capped the residential power cost recovery (PCR) rate at \$0.00681 per kWh for a period of one year to assist that customer class by reducing the impact of increasing purchased power costs. It is estimated that this action will reduce L&P revenues in fiscal year 2011-12 by \$550,000. Some Board Members desired a similar plan for L&P's commercial and industrial (C&I) customers.

Attached for your review is a spreadsheet entitled "PCR Summary" that provides history of the actual and billed PCR rates. Also attached is a spreadsheet that shows the financial impact of staff's proposal to cap the C&I PCR rate at \$0.012 cents per kWh beginning September 1, 2011 through August 31, 2012. This action would reduce L&P revenues by approximately \$1 million dollars while providing some rate relief for the C&I customers through next summer. It is anticipated that L&P's net income for 2011-2012 would be approximately \$500,000.

If the Board were to approve this rate plan, the average <u>annual</u> bill reduction for L&P's 2,983 commercial customers would be approximately \$180; while the <u>annual</u> bill reduction for L&P's 40 industrial customers would average approximately \$11,400.

Staff recommends approval of this item to provide an equitable PCR application for all customer classes. The utility has sufficient revenues to cover the \$1 million reduction in revenues. Further, staff will include an update to the Board on anticipated PCR rates and resulting revenues through the annual budget process.

Update Regarding Better Buildings Block Grant

Brian Beauchamp, from the Michigan Land Use Institute will make a short presentation regarding the Better Buildings for Michigan Block Grant. The Department of Energy grant will target energy efficiency improvements for two Traverse City neighborhoods. This includes energy audits and interest free loans for energy efficiency improvements.

Light and Power will provide up to 15 cfl bulbs, pipe wrap, low flow shower heads, automatic set back thermostats, and information on incentives for recycling refrigerators, dehumidifiers, a/c units, along with energy saving brochures.
