Dear Chairman and Board Members:

The Traverse City Light and Power Department has been requested to remove its Judgment Lien against Brewery Creek Condominium Association in connection with the purchase of certain units and other property at the Brewery Creek Condominium site by Elmwood Township. I have not recommended that this lien be removed primarily because it may be necessary to enforce that lien if the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals rules against the Traverse City Light and Power Department regarding the enforcement of delinquent utility bills through the tax collection procedure. As you know, we have been paid in full for the entire deficiency primarily as a result of the Leelanau County Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund.

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Elmwood Township is engaged in a substantial public improvement in the Greilickville area. Because the Judgment Lien presents an obstacle to that development, and because the Judgment Lien may never need to be enforced, Chairman Pat McGuire, Executive Director Ed Rice, Board Member Barbara Budros, and myself met with representatives of Elmwood Township and others in a meeting convened by Mayor Estes. The purpose of the meeting was to see if there was an alternative or compromise which would allow the Greilickville improvements to occur but still provide some security for TCL&P.

The result of that meeting and our recommendation to you is to share the risk with the Township and cap the Township's exposure should the Judgment Lien need to be enforced. The total amount of the original delinquency was roughly \$250,000. The proposed compromise is to reduce that in half so that if the lien needed to be enforced against property the Township was purchasing, the greatest exposure it would have would be \$125,000. The Township would have three years to pay the amount and sell excess property as the source of such payments.

Attached is the proposed Agreement.

If you approve of this compromise, the following motion would be appropriate:

MOVED BY ______, SECONDED BY ______, TO APPROVE THE AGREEMENT REGARDING JUDGMENT LIEN WITH ELMWOOD TOWNSHIP AND TO AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN AND SECRETARY TO EXECUTE THAT AGREEMENT UPON APPROVAL AS TO FORM BY GENERAL COUNSEL.

Accordingly, if the Deficiency must be paid, the Township shall have three (3) years from the date of entry of the final order or decision in the federal court case described above in which to pay TCL&P the sum of \$125,000.00. This amount shall be paid even if the unneeded lands have not been sold by the end of this three (3) year period.
